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Separation based on a direct threat must be individualized and include consideration of reasonable accommodations likely to reduce level of risk to others and the Supreme Court's test, which demands analysis of "the nature, duration and severity of the risk."



Colleges are not the ultimate insurers of all student safety. They have a duty to act with reasonable care when aware of a foreseeable threat of violence in a curricular setting.

When circumstances put a school on notice that a student is at risk to commit violence against other students, the school has a responsibility to take appropriate steps to warn or protect foreseeable victims.

Previous interactions with a student, such as an awareness of emotional concerns, previous incidents of suicidal ideation, and a student's status at the institution (full-time, living on-campus) should inform decisions about how to intervene with a student.

DISABILITY DISMISSAL

- Unqualified for the program based on program expectations set for all students at start of program or...
- the student's accommodation needs fundamentally alter the program or service
- the accommodation necessary for the student to become qualified poses an undue burden to the college or university
- the student poses a direct threat to the health or safety of others that cannot be eliminated or reduced by providing a reasonable accommodation.

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MEDICAL LEAVE

- Have clear policy
- Practice policy consistently
- Understand challenges of forced leave
- Apply equally to physical and mental illness
- Educate student about financial impact
- Avoid readmission pitfalls
- Don't skip conduct process for weapons or community disruptive behaviors
- Understand limits to self-injury separation
- Understand limits of harm to others application

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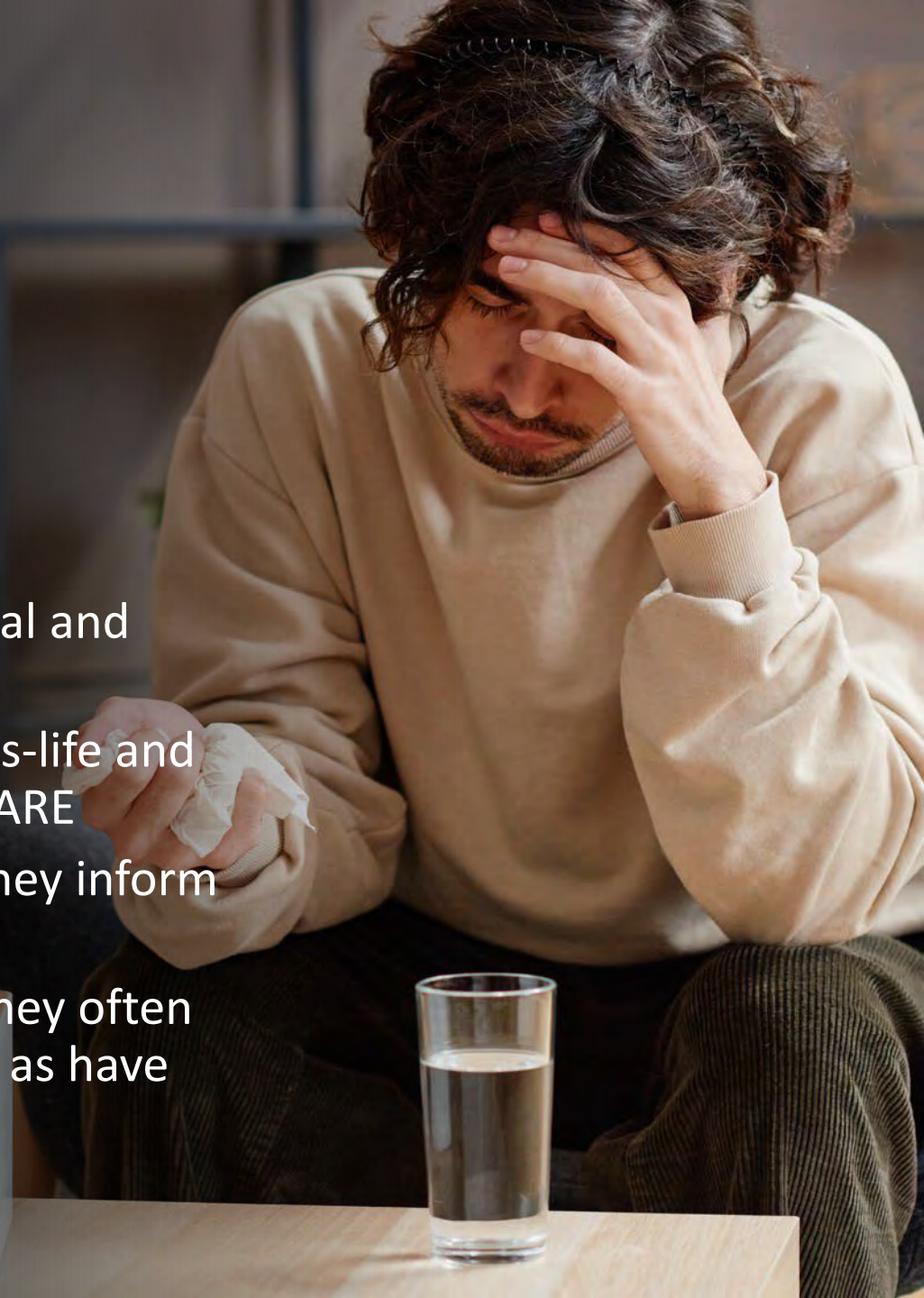

CONDUCT

- Use a progressive conduct policy
- Make use of punitive, developmental and restorative conduct approaches
- Address silos present in separate res-life and conduct processes - lean into BIT/CARE
- Attend to past conduct actions as they inform future conduct outcomes
- Be wary of “no harm” contacts as they often convey an awareness of risk as well as have little efficacy

State Confidentiality Laws

These laws govern various types of medical and mental health practice.

Some medical examples include medical doctors, physician assistants, nurses, athletic trainers, and physical therapists.

Some mental health examples include licensed professional counselors, licensed social workers, psychologists, psychiatrists, substance abuse counselors (LADC), marriage and family counselors, dance and movement therapists, couples' counselors, and those who are licensed with a master's in divinity.
